REFLECTION - A SERVANT'S FAITH

Habakkuk 1:2-3, 2:2-4 Psalm 94 2 Timothy 1:6-8, 13-14 Luke 17:5-10 "Were your faith the size of a mustard seed" From the Gospel this weekend we learn that faith also requires a servant's heart. We can't just be people who do really good things as this can become an exercise in ego building. We would feel that we are paving our path to heaven through our own actions. We are here to serve and to let God do the rest: 'We are merely servants; we have done no more than our duty.' True discipleship requires humble service. Jesus makes it very clear what we are supposed to do. We must care for the less fortunate in our midst. In the first reading, we also learn that faith requires patience. The prophet is calling on the Lord and nothing seems to happen. We must trust that God is working in our lives. It is a faith that calls for trust. We can't let our hearts be hardened by the trials we
