TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Isaiah 5:1-7

REFLECTION

Philippians 4:6-9

Matthew 21:33-43

In the First Reading, Isaiah describes God as the owner of a beautiful vineyard that has been carefully tended. The owner does everything possible to produce a healthy crop of grapes. But he ends up with sour, wild grapes. The prophet warns the inhabitants of Jerusalem and Judah that they, the vine, will be abandoned (rejected) by God. In the Gospel we hear about 'the Parable of the Wicked Tenants.' It is not difficult to see that the owner of the vineyard is God. The wicked tenants are those who exercise moral authority: the chief priests and the elders. The tenants seize, beat, stone and even kill them all. The obvious meaning of the parable is completed by the rejection of the tenants and the giving of the vineyard to those who are prepared to work in the vineyard to produce good fruit. The chief priests and the elders fully understand that the parable is attacking them. In the Second Reading St. Paul exhorts the Philippians who have produced fruits that correspond to the Gospel. They don't need to have anxieties for the God of peace will be with them.

ROSARY MONTH The month of October each year is dedicated to the Most Holy Rosary. This is primarily due to the fact that the liturgical feast of Our Lady of the Rosary is celebrated annually on October 7. It was instituted to honour the Blessed Virgin Mary in gratitude for the protection that she gives the Church in answer to the praying of the Rosary by the faithful. The current Mass will always have the name "St Joseph's RC Parish, UK Live Stream". This will be the Mass to watch if you want to watch live, and Fr Naz will enable it about 10 minutes before Mass starts. It takes Al Hood a little a time to relabel it, so will have that name for a short while after it is live.

If you want to watch previous Masses on "catch up", Al will relabel these by their date and time when he gets the chance - e.g. "Thursday 7pm Mass, 1/10/2020 – St Joseph's RC Parish, Malvern, UK".

We will have one week's worth of Masses on "catch up", but after a week they will be removed from the channel to prevent a large and potentially confusing back archive to develop.
