## REFLECTION – PENTECOST SUNDAY

Acts 2:1-11

Psalms 103:1, 24, 29-31, 34

John 14: 15-16, 23-26

### LIFE-SAVING SURGERY FOR FR RICHARD KIZZEYO

The Vaughan Spruces are raising funds for life-saving surgery for their good friend & priest, Fr Richard Kizzeyo who has been diagnosed with a rare heart condition called an abdominal aortoiliac dissection. He has served as a priest in the UK, is himself a doctor and is currently at home in Uganda where his blood pressure is being kept as low as possible. He needs surgery within the month to survive.
