



# REFLECTION

The Gospel today, in typical Markan fashion, is telling us a lot in a short space of time. Jesus is travelling through the "Decapolis" – a confederation of ten Gentile cities – and happens to come across a deaf man with a speech impediment. In Jesus, God is active in the world and brings healing and peace, even if here He tries to do so quietly. This is ironic, however, given what takes place. The description of the Lord putting His fingers into the man's ears and touching his tongue with spittle is similar to the action described in John 9:6. In fact, Mark has Jesus spit on the eyes of a blind man in the very next chapter (no.8). So, what is this saying? Firstly, it is clear that God does not hold back but is physically involved with us. Secondly, it is most likely that a very striking message is being sent through these actions. In 17th Century B.C. Babylonian epics, gods and goddesses would use their saliva to create. Here, then, Jesus is effectively claiming to be the Lord of Creation! Hence, why the people are said to be "astonished beyond measure", and quote our first reading from Isaiah. The long-hoped-for Day of the Lord has arrived for Israel.
