#### REFLECTION

Mac 7:1-2, 9-14 Psalm 17

2 Thes 2:16-3:5

Lk 20:27-38

The Sadducees in the Gospel did not believe in the Resurrection. To ridicule this belief, they created the story of the seven brothers who marry their brother's widow all dying leaving her without a child before she dies herself. The Sadducees question Jesus 'On the day of the resurrection, to which of them will the woman be wife?' The Sadducees were in fact out to mock the faith of the seven Maccabean brothers for which they and their mother died in the First Reading. Jesus' answer has two parts. In the first one, He tries to make clear that the marriage institution has no reason to be in the next life: 'those who are considered worthy of the world to come and of resurrection from the dead, there is no more marriage' The second part of the answer leaves two certitudes with us: 'For he is God of the living and not of the dead.' To trust in this God means to realize that we are meant to be alive. And being alive consists of being with Him in a continuous manner, forever.
