Matthew 18: 15-20

Ezekiel 33: 7-9 The theme of listening runs throughout today's readings: listening to the Divine Voice; to the voice of the prophet Ezekiel; to our community members; to the Church. In the First Reading, God points out that the prophet has the task of warning people of approaching danger. Ezekiel must point out to the community both their sins and their consequences. In the Gospel, Jesus advises us of our duty to do what we can when an individual's behaviour is a threat to the community. Paul emphasises that the precious freedom bought for us by Christ also brings with it a responsibility and a debt: to love and care for each other and to live out the consequences of our faith. These words go to the heart of the Gospel message. Jesus has shown us how to love our neighbour by everything he said and did. He also shows us how to be fully alive as a human being. Amidst the distractions and bustle of daily life, we pray to be alert for the quiet Divine voice, and to be generous in responding to it.
