

NINETEENTH SUNDAY IN ORIDNARY TIME

Year B REFLECTION

7th to 8th August 2021

1 Kings 19: 4-8;

Psalm 33 (34);

Ephesians 30-5:2;

John: 6: 41-51

Today's readings demonstrate how our Father draws us closer to himself, and – through Jesus Christ – nourishes and sustains us with the living bread of the Eucharist. In the First Reading, the prophet Elijah is convinced he's a failure, and is fleeing for his life into the wilderness. However, an angel of God rouses him from his depression, and comforts and nourishes him for his long journey to the 'mountain of God'. In the Gospel, those hostile to Jesus are complaining against him, confused by and misunderstanding his teachings. But Jesus challenges their criticism directly: he is the one who has come to reveal the Father to them. Jesus teaches that he himself is the true, living bread from heaven; bread that gives life for ever. The Psalmist thanks God for deliverance from trouble, inviting us to 'Taste and see that the Lord is good'. Let us pray this week for an openness to the Lord's tender, nourishing care, especially when we experience times of alienation, self-doubt or despair. We pray to deepen our acknowledgment of our human vulnerability, and our utter dependence on God's grace and love.

RULES AT MASS FROM SUNDAY 15th AUGUST

- · disinfect hands upon arrival & departure
- face masks should be worn at Sat evening and Sun morning Masses
- face masks are optional at weekday Masses
- sign of peace is still suspended
- Holy Communion will continue under one kind
- From 6pm on 14th Aug, congregants will come up to the Sanctuary for Holy Communion*
- if you do not scan the track and trace QR code, please fill in a contact tracing slip on arrival
- chairs in the centre of church will remain as they are
- all side pews will be available for use
- stewards will clean after Masses on Sat evenings, Sun mornings, Mon and Thurs
- · Congregants may sing hymns at Sun Mass

- Doors will be kept open for ventilation
- If you prefer lots of social distance between you and other parishioners, please consider attending Mass on Mon, Tues, Thurs, Fri or Sat morning.
