THIRTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME Remembrance Day

7 November – 8 November 2020

Matthew 25: 1-13



Wisdom 6:12-16

1 Thessalonians 4:13-18

Remembrance Sunday remains one of the few examples of civic religion in our world today. Unfortunately, due to the current lockdown we are unable to perform this civic ceremony this year. While Remembrance Sunday is a moment to pray for those who gave their lives for humanity, there is an urgent need to remember the society which they died for. The society for which those great men and women died is in great need of hearing the music of hope at the present moment. Jesus in the parable of the Ten Virgins describes how He desires to find His disciples going about the tasks He has assigned them. To live in vigilance means that society is prepared to do the tasks that they have been appointed to do in the current lockdown. The bridegroom is on his way. He is coming, and we must have hope. Am I willing to wait on God even when I don't know how long it will take? Can I faithfully entrust myself to the unknown with the certainty of God's goodness? Talk to Jesus about these things during this second lockdown.
