### TRINITY OFFERS THE GIFT OF RELATIONSHIP

The Feast of the Most Holy Trinity calls our attention to the great mystery of God. One way of entering into this mystery is to recognise that our God is never a hoarder of power but one who freely delegates out this power. Delegation calls for relationship. The Trinity offers us a precious gift of relationship, a grounded connection with God, self, others and the world. This Easter Season invited us to be in relationship with Jesus; it awakened us to a way of living, loving and relating. We are invited to be like the Trinity-living in absolute relatedness. Looking back to the pandemic, I realize more and more that we were all together in a web of mutual interdependence. When we recognize this on a spiritual level, we call it love. We know it is through Love, we come to know God. As Christians we believe that God is revealed to us as a Trinity-three persons who are who they are because of how they love one another. It is in God's nature to love, to reach out to all.

After a thorough examination, it is now apparent he needs two separate procedures.
