Mass Intentions

An individual may ask a priest to offer Mass for several reasons: for example, in thanksgiving, for the intentions of another person (such as on a birthday), or for the repose of the soul of someone who has died.

In his encyclical 'Ecclesia de Eucharistia', our late Holy Father, Pope John Paul II, taught, "In the celebration of the Eucharistic Sacrifice, the Church prays that God, the Father of all mercies, will grant His children the fullness of the Holy Spirit so that they may become one body and one spirit in Christ. In raising this prayer of the father of lights, from whom comes every good endowment and every perfect gift, the Church believes that she will be heard, for she prays in union with Christ her Head and Spouse, who takes up this plea of His Bride and joins it to His own redemptive sacrifice" (No.43).

If you would like to have a mass offered for someone, envelopes are available in the narthex on which you may put the details, and make an offering if you wish. Weekend masses are popularly requested but there are often weekday masses with no intentions so do please consider a weekday.
