THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

Year C

13th to 14th August 2022

REFLECTION

Apocalypse 11:19; 12:1-6

Psalm 44 1

Corinthians 15: 20-26 Luke 1: 39-56

The Feast of the Assumption of Mary ordinarily celebrated on 15th August has been transferred to the nearest Sunday which is this weekend. In 1950 Pope Pius XII defined Mary's Assumption into heaven as a dogma of Roman Catholicism. The Church teaches that The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary is a necessary belief for all those who call themselves Catholic. The church's teaching stipulates that "The Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory." It is not only the Catholic Church that professes this belief in the Assumption of Mary but also Eastern Orthodox Christians and Oriental Orthodox Christians. While the Assumption was only formally defined by the Church in 1950, it is a belief shared by Christians everywhere and dates back to apostolic times. Perhaps one of the biggest arguments in favour of the Assumption is that there is a complete (and curious) silence about her bodily remains which cries out for an explanation. In the case of the Assumption, the silence is deafening.
