TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Year C REFLECTION 15th to 16th October 2022

Exodus 17:8-13

Psalm 121:1-8

2 Timothy 3:14-4:2

Luke 18:1-8

This Sunday's readings provide a clear reflection, on prayer. Joshua and the Israelites are told to look to the hilltops in today's First Reading. They are to find their help there—through the intercession of Moses. What is being shown here is the need to remain steadfast in prayer in spite of fatigue and tiredness. Like Joshua and the Israelites, the widow in the Gospel of Luke is facing opposition and injustice from godless and pitiless adversaries. We, too, must lift our eyes to the mountains—to Calvary and the God who will guard us against all evil. Let us heed Jesus' call for prayer without ceasing. Prayer must be regarded as necessary since belief in Christ cannot be understood without a personal relationship with God in prayer. Christianity is a mystery, a mystery that demands this personal relationship. Without this, there is no living faith. Of course, there are many different forms of prayer, both public and private, but any of the forms need to have this personal relationship with God, and in the Christian tradition under the guidance of the Holy Spirit.
