REFLECTION

Isaiah 45: 1, 4-6 Psalm 95 Thessalonians 1: 1-15, Matthew 22: 15-21

In the first reading God says that it is for the sake of 'Israel my chosen one' that I have called you by your name ... I am the Lord, unrivalled.' The glorious psalm also proclaims this greatness of God and urges 'you families of peoples' to give the Lord the glory of his name. Paul tells his brothers in Thessaloniki that they are loved and chosen by God which he recognised in the way they responded to the Good News with utter conviction. In today's Gospel, the scheming Pharisees and Herodians attempt to trap Jesus into declaring if he thought it was permissible to pay taxes to Caesar or not. Jesus' response,' Give back to Caesar what belongs to Caesar, and to God what belongs to God' instructs us to honour the authority of government, but not to compromise our beliefs and to recognise the Glory of God. As children of God we must give of ourselves to Him for we belong to him. In this week, in which we have a special collection for **Missio**, let us remember our family in need everywhere and support them with generosity and prayers. Let us pray that we may receive and act on the Gospel as did the Thessalonians, with utter conviction.
