## **REFLECTION**



Ezekiel 18: 25–28 Philippians 2: 1–11

Matthew 21: 28-32

This week we are invited to reflect on our need for a change of heart. We are called to follow the Lord's way, as we try to model our actions and words on his. The Jews in exile complained that the Lord was unjust, but the prophet Ezekiel tells them they should look at their own behaviour rather than blame others (First Reading). St Paul encourages the Philippians to be united in love, purpose and mind, which they should model on the mind of Christ himself. Although divine and equal with God, Christ was humble enough to become as we are, and even then, to die on a cross (Second Reading). No matter which group in society we belong to, only a true change of heart, where we welcome the Good News, will open the way to the Kingdom of God (Gospel). This week, we may want to focus on trying to live according to Jesus's values. We ask the Lord to help shape our minds to be like his, so that people around us will see that love is shown in deeds more than in words.
