## **First Sunday of Advent**

#### 28 November – 29 November 2020

#### REFLECTION ON THE SEASON OF ADVENT



Advent begins with the Sunday that falls closest to November 30<sup>th</sup>. The season of Advent has a twofold character. It is a time of preparation for Christmas when the first coming of God's son to humanity is recalled. It is also a season when minds are directed by this memorial to Christ's second coming at the end of time. It is thus a time of joyful and spiritual expectation. The origin of Advent dates back to the 5<sup>th</sup> century and is influenced by the Eastern Church. The primary focus of this liturgy was expectation of the Lord's birth at Christmas. The first evidence of the Roman observance of the season occurred around the 6<sup>th</sup> century. There was little emphasis placed on the second coming. The focus was on preparation for the celebration of Christ's birth. At the same time other shifts took place concerning the final judgement of humanity which saw Advent take on penitential overtones. The First Sunday of Advent begins a new liturgical year and liturgical cycle: CYCLE B. During this year we encounter Jesus through the eyes of Mark, the evangelists. Advent prepares us for the coming of the Saviour. We must ask ourselves "From what do we need saving?"
