### THE SHEPHERD WHO SPEAKS ABOUT HIMSELF

Today Jesus speaks of himself as the 'Good Shepherd'. The sheep know his voice, trust him, and will follow only him. In consequence today is Vocations Sunday, when the Church prays for new 'good shepherds' to lead our Christian communities, especially at this difficult time. Let us to reflect on how our church will fare for priests in the future. Right now priests are an ageing and diminishing group which raises a number of questions. Who will shepherd the church in the coming years? Shall we need to re-think the conditions for ordination or re-imagine the mode of having Eucharistic celebrants for the future? Shall we need to examine how the priesthood of the baptised can be exercised in the coming decades? Do we need a new model of ministerial priesthood? On this Vocations Sunday, perhaps I can also consider how I am responding to the way Jesus is calling me, and pray, that others also hear his invitation.
