## REFLECTION

What does it mean to love your neighbour as yourself? It means that we should do unto others as we would have them do unto us. This is what Jesus taught us. **Mass Intentions:** For mass intentions please provide the name of the intention, if it is for a person then whether the person is deceased, the preferred date/time of the mass and the number of masses required. You may put a stipend in the envelope which goes directly to the priest offering the mass. Mass offering envelopes are available in the narthex or you may use your own envelope. Envelopes may be put in the collection baskets or in the parish letter box.
