THE GOD WHO SPEAKS IN THE FIFTH WEEK OF EASTER



This week's readings speak powerfully of faith, hope and trust in God. God's word inspires, sustains and encourages us as we continue to live with the impacts of current events. St Peter (Second Reading) speaks of the difficulties of living without faith, and, rejoices that those who are believers can be close to Jesus and become a holy people living in the light of God. In the Psalm we are invited to remember God as the source of hope in difficulty, and to offer praise and thanksgiving with joy. The Gospel is part of Jesus's farewell to his disciples. Although he will leave them physically, he asks them not to be troubled but to trust in God. He invites us also to trust. We will not be left alone, but will know our Risen Lord as the Way, the Truth and the Life, and be enabled to live the way, truth and life of Jesus for others. Let us ask Jesus for the grace to live this week in hope, trust and joy. May your love be upon us, O Lord, as we place all our hope in you.

Pope Encourages The Faithful to Pray Rosary at Home Pope Francis has written a Letter for the Month of May to all the faithful, encouraging them to pray the Rosary, especially during the month of May. In the letter, published on the feast of St Mark the Evangelist (25 April), the Pope notes that it is a tradition to pray the Rosary at home with the family during this month. This year, he continues, "the restrictions of the pandemic have made us come to appreciate all the more this 'family' aspect, also from a spiritual point of view". That is why he is proposing to everyone "rediscover the beauty of praying the Rosary at home in the month of May", whether individually or as a group, "making the most both opportunities". Pope Francis also proposes two new prayers to the Blessed Virgin Mary, which can be recited at the end of the Rosary. In his letter, he assures the faithful that he too will be reciting those prayers throughout the month of May, "in spiritual union with all of you". Pope Francis's letter and the two new prayers he has proposed are posted on the parish website
