### REFLECTION

**Malachi 3:19-20**

**Psalm 98**

**2 Thessalonica 3:7-12**

**Luke 21:5-19**

We find ourselves between two comings: the first coming of Our Lord and His last coming. Talk about the end of the world and everybody gets interested. The disciples were, too, when Jesus predicted some apocalyptic events. "Well," they asked, "when will all that bad stuff happen?" In answering them, Jesus anticipates this day with caution. He warns his disciples and us to be critical and not to be carried away by voices claiming "the time has come." We should not easily interpret the onslaught of famines, earthquakes, and war as signs of the end. Despite the daily signs that our world is seemingly falling apart physically and morally, we must not be afraid. In principle, the Day of the Lord is always a day that has already come but at the same time, it is a day yet to come. Thus, we find ourselves at the time of waiting for the day when He will come again in glory. Lord, let the young families in countries torn by war get a glimpse of joy, peace, comfort, and love despite worldly distractions.

**THE WORLD DAY OF THE POOR, 13 NOVEMBER 2022 :** It is the sixth World Day of the Poor, with the theme of "For your sakes Christ became poor" (2 Cor 8:9). Pope Francis, in his message for the day, laments that just as the world was emerging from the "tempest of the pandemic", a new catastrophe appeared on the horizon: the Russian invasion of Ukraine and the brutal war which has followed. The war has displaced millions of Ukrainian people and caused global economic turbulence, with food shortages and rising energy costs which will affect the poorest this winter.
