REFLECTION

1 Peter 4:13-16

John 17: 1-11

The First Reading tells us that after Jesus was taken up into heaven, His disciples—including the Apostles and Mary, his mother—return to the upper room. This is the very place where Our Lord himself had celebrated the Last Supper. There, they devote themselves with one accord to prayer, awaiting the Spirit that He promised would come upon them. The Gospel passage as well is dominated by prayer. Jesus prayed for his disciples before they faced the challenge of his suffering and death on the cross. We easily and naturally focus on the suffering of Jesus. The pain and danger, however, were not exclusively his. The path to the glory Jesus refers to will be the cause of division, fear, and uncertainty for this band of brothers. They run the very real risk of being dis-banded. In this prayer Jesus does not to focus on his suffering. Rather Jesus prays in the hope the oneness of his disciples will be preserved. He has kept them together this far. This prayer is entrusting them into the gentle and gracious hands of his Father.
