THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

Year A THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

Acts 2:14,22-28 Psalm 16 1Peter 1:17-21 Luke 24: 13-35

The disciples in today's Gospel are clearly downcast and confused. As they make their way down to Emmaus by road they cannot make head and tail of all the things that have occurred. They know what they've seen—a prophet mighty in word and deed. They know what they were hoping for—that He would be the redeemer of Israel. But they don't know what to make of His violent death at the hands of their rulers. They can't even recognize Jesus as He draws near to walk with them. He seems like just another foreigner visiting Jerusalem for the Passover. Jesus doesn't disclose His identity to them until they describe how they found His tomb empty but *"Him they did not see."* How does Jesus make Himself known at Emmaus? First, He interprets *"all the Scriptures"* as referring to Him. Jesus is described as a new Moses and a new Passover lamb. He is the one of whom David sang in today's Psalm, whose soul was not abandoned to corruption but was shown the path of life.
