Day of prayer for the Candidates for the Sacraments

'Rejoice! This child of mine was lost, and is found!' On this midway Sunday through Lent, we celebrate with hope and joy before we enter the darker times of Holy Week. Today we particularly rejoice in the reconciliation and forgiveness of sins bought for us by Jesus's suffering and death. In the First Reading, the Israelites celebrate their first Passover in the Promised Land. They rejoice that God has brought them to a place where the fruit of the earth feeds them. St Paul speaks of the 'new creation' made possible by Christ's suffering and death. Because of this, we ourselves are called to share the good news of forgiveness with others. The Gospel relates the story of the return of the prodigal son. We witness the total and utter forgiveness the father bestows on his selfish and wayward son. Just as the father forgives his son, we too will be forgiven, if we express sorrow for actions and inactions that take us away from God. As we celebrate the joy of knowing that we are totally loved and forgiven, in these final weeks of Lent we ask for the grace to see ourselves as God sees us, and to see others just as God sees them too.
