



#### REFLECTION

Wisd 1:13-15, 2:23-24 Ps 30:2, 4-6, 11-13 2 Cor 8:7, 9, 13-15 Mark 5:21-24, 35-43

In today's Gospel, we see Jesus liberate a little girl from the possession of death. Here is an event that led the disciples to understand Jesus' authority and power over the final enemy, death. But much more, here is an episode that strengthens our hope that we too will be raised from the dead, along with all our loved ones who sleep in Christ. Jesus commands the girl to "Arise!" This command is a pointer to what will happen to him after his death. The consoling message of today's Gospel is that Jesus is the resurrection and the life. If we believe in Him, even though we die, we will live. We are called to have the same faith as the parents in the Gospel story. Notice the parents follow Him even though those in their own house tell them there is no hope, and even though others ridicule Jesus' claim that the dead have only fallen asleep. We should rejoice, as we sing in today's Psalm, that He has brought us up from the pit of death.
