Let us approach Jesus for liberation.

Jesus did not use his authority and divine power to rule and control people. He came to set people free. Hence, let us approach Jesus with trusting faith so that he may free us from the evil spirits that keep us from praying and prevent us from loving and sharing our blessings with others. He also frees us from all the 'evil spirits' of fear, compulsions, selfishness, anger, resentment, and hostility. "I have come that they may have life, life in abundance." So, Jesus should be a source of liberation for us. May he free us from all those spirits which make us deaf, dumb, blind, lame and paralyzed, physically and spiritually. Through Word and Sacrament, he brings that power to us and says to the demons in our life, "Be gone!" He says it as often as we need to hear it, over and over again, until by his power we are free from them all. Christ has power over any demon. Each Monday in Lent we would like to welcome you to a shared simple lunch of soup and bread in the McEnnis Room. Mass is at 11.30am followed by lunch in the McEnnis Room at 12 noon. Everyone is welcome but we also need volunteers to either prepare or buy in the soup & bread. Help is always forthcoming to heat and serve the lunch on the day. In the past we have regularly had around 20 people sharing lunch, so that is a good estimate to work to. We do not ask people to sign up to coming in advance.

All the crockery and cutlery etc needed is provided in the McEnnis Room kitchen. Payment is voluntary and based on what you can give. The funds help to pay for the soup and any surplus supports the work of our parish One World Group. If you can help by taking on responsibility for providing the soup & bread on one of the Monday's, please sign up on the sheet in the narthex.

Answer – coming together to eat together during Lent, in a simple way, provides a connection between us and those less well off than us.
