



REFLECTION

Apocalypse 7:2-4, 9-14

Psalm 23:1

John 3:1-3

Matthew 5:1-12

On this feast day we are reminded not only of those Saints who have gone before us, but also of the many inspirational people living saintly lives here on earth. The example of their lives of love and service inspire us on our own journey to the promise of eternal life. The Psalm reminds us of the blessings that will come to those who seek the Lord through living life with clean hands and pure heart. In the Second Reading, St John's letter speaks of the love lavished upon us by God the Father. Jesus's teaching in the Gospel outlines the wealth of blessings that come from living our lives well, and serving others. We are again reminded that although being true to his example may lead to persecution and rejection, we will be rewarded in heaven. This week, we ask the Lord's help to be generous with our prayers, our time, and our possessions in responding to the plight of those in our world who experience the harsh realities of persecution, loss and injustice on a daily basis; especially the people of Afghanistan.



REMEMBERING THE DEAD IN NOVEMBER

November is a time to pray & give thanks for all those who have been an important part of our lives but are sadly no longer with us. Envelopes containing a blank form are available in the Narthex for anyone wishing to submit names of their loved ones for prayers during November. Please leave the envelopes with the list of names in the basket in front of the altar. Every Tuesday in November names submitted in the week will be read at 9.15am Mass. An offering in the envelope is welcome but not required.

Blessing of Graves for All Souls' Day will take place on **Tuesday, Nov 2nd, at 10.30am**. If you have family or friends buried in Great Malvern Cemetery, let us gather for a brief communal service. There will be individual blessing of the graves of your loved ones. Please meet at the chapel in the cemetery at 10:30am.

A Parish Mass for all those who have died in the last year will be celebrated at 7pm on **Thursday, 18th November**. If you wish to submit names of your family or friends please submit their names to the parish office. A candle will be prepared for each of the deceased and if you wish you can make a donation of £1 for the candle. These candles will be blessed and lit at the Mass on the day and you will be asked to carry them to the sanctuary during the Mass. They may be taken home after the Mass.
