## FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

Q: If I were to ask you what comes to mind when I say "LENT" what would you say?

### Lilkely responses:

- Penance
- A time to give things up
- A season for going to confession

## Q: But have you ever thought of Lent as the season of love?

But I would propose a living, healthy, loving heart as the symbol of Lent.

✤ As such I would say that lent is a season of awakening our hearts.

*"Rend your hearts, not your garments,"* cries the prophet Joel on Ash Wednesday.

Today's Gospel reinforce this cry.

- What Jesus goes through at the hands of the devil is an attack on that living and healthy heart of Jesus
- Every temptation that the devil throws out is meant to dislocate that healthy and loving heart of Jesus.

### **FIRST TEMPTATION**

The first temptation has to do with the **control over things**: Satan says, *"You are hungry. Use your power. Change these stones into bread."* 

**<u>low</u>**: The devil is appealing to the heart of Jesus to yield his powers for his own benefit.

 This is in direct contrast to Jesus is meant to yield to his powers for the transformation of people's lives

# SECOND TEMPTATION

The second temptation is manipulating the heart of Jesus to become a controller of people *"I will give you power over all the kingdoms of the world"* 

 This is again in contrast to the enabling mission of Jesus: his mission is to empower these Kingdoms and its peoples, not to control them for his advantage.

## THIRD TEMPTATION

The third temptation is appealing to Jesus to control God: forcing God's intervention: *"Leap off the Temple, God will take care of you"* 

 Which is in direct contrast to the disposition of Jesus to do God's will.

### EASTER, TIME TO RENOUNCE SATAN.

The next 40 days to Easter we are preparing our hearts to **renounce satan** as Jesus did:

"Rend our hearts" cries Joel: this for us today means that we have to

- "peel away the tough rind that can surround our heart."
- "peel away the rind of indifference"
- > Peel away the **tough skin** that hardens our heart.
- May this Lenten time become a season of a-heart-renewed, of falling in love once again with our God and our neighbour.

As the Fast Day for CAFOD is upon us this coming Friday, may I ask Michael Townson, our Parish CAFOD Rep to outline some of the practical ways in which CAFOD is appealing to us to turn this Lenten time into **a Season of Love**.
