The Genealogy of Jesus

We are a week away from Christmas Eve. Today's gospel is the Genealogy of Jesus. This genealogy spans the whole history of salvation, from Abraham on, through David up to Jesus. From this we do note that the coming of Jesus is situated within the descendants of Abraham and Sarah. The list contains saints and sinners, honest and corrupt figures. Let us ask the Lord to help us accept the gifts and limits of our life and let him work through them so that we are firmly rooted in him. How do I see my call to follow Jesus in the light of that genealogy?
