

Introduction:

As we enter into the month of November, we always have a special concern to pray for the Holy Souls – those of our families and friends who have died.

There are Four Dimensions of the Faith which we can put around the cross, making sure that Jesus Christ is the centre of everything we do:



These notes will use these colours to show the balance of activities – some of course reflect more than one dimension of the faith, but over the month, try to pick a variety of activities.

Date	Feast/memorial	Activity
1 st	All Saints Day	Family reflection on the Gospel:
November	Gospel: Matthew 5:1-12 Seeing the crowds, Jesus went up the hill. There he sat down and was joined by his disciples. Then he began to speak. This is what he taught them: 'How happy are the poor in spirit; theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Happy the gentle: they shall have the earth for their heritage. Happy those who mourn: they shall be comforted. Happy those who hunger and thirst for what is right: they shall be satisfied. Happy the merciful: they shall have mercy shown them. Happy the pure in heart: they shall see God. Happy the peacemakers: they shall be called sons of God. Happy those who are persecuted in the cause of right: theirs is the kingdom of heaven. 'Happy are you when people abuse you and persecute you and speak all kinds of calumny against you on my account. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven.'	 The translation we hear at Mass says "happy" but traditionally the word is "blessed". To be blessed is to be happy. When we are blessed by God we are filled with His deep joy which is not dependent upon "things." Light a candle Someone read this Gospel passage our loud Discuss together some of these questions (depending upon the age profile of the family) Who is Jesus talking to? Who does He describe as happy? Who has the kingdom of heaven as their reward? Who will be comforted? (who will be doing the comforting?) Who will be satisfied? Why? Think about the people we know who smile a lot, who don't complain, and who are good and kind to other people. Say a prayer for these people as they are the ones whom Jesus is blessing. Ask the Holy Spirit to help us to be happy and positive even when things are difficult.

	friends who have died	 Depending upon how many names there are, you could read them out and either pray a "Hail Mary" for each person, or after each name, say "Lord have mercy on him/her" Finish by saying: Eternal Rest give unto them O Lord, may they rest in peace, Amen." and make the Sign of the Cross. Make sure that you put a copy of this list in an envelope to be put under the Altar at Mass.
4 th	St. Charles Borromeo	Ask St. Charles Borromeo to pray for Jithin and all
November	St. Charles was a nephew of the Pope and was made a cardinal when he was only 21. He was expected to live like a lord in a castle, but instead he worked very hard in Milan in Italy teaching the faith and training men to be good priests.
